Duke of Edinburgh's Award Bronze Expedition





The Duke of Edinburgh's Award program at Llantwit Major School celebrated another milestone with the successful completion of the Bronze expedition by a group of determined and enthusiastic Year 10 students. The expedition saw the participants embark on an adventurous journey from our school to Peterston-super-Ely and camping overnight at the picturesque Jubilee Camp Site.

Preparation and Training

The journey began weeks in advance with rigorous preparation and training. Students participated in navigation workshops, first aid training, and physical conditioning to ensure they were ready for the challenges ahead. Their commitment to teamwork and perseverance was evident as they honed their skills under the guidance of our experienced DofE leaders.



The Expedition

Lego and K'NEX Club



Water Safety Wales information

In 2023 there was an increase in the number of fatalities in and around water amongst young people, and we have already seen a number of drowning fatalities this year. We must work together to prevent more deaths.

Data from 2023 shows that boys aged 10-19 are particularly at risk of accidental drowning and that 59% of fatalities occurred on inland waters (rivers, lakes, canals etc).

One drowning is too many. We urge you to remind children and young people of our four simple tips to help them stay safe around open water. Knowing these tips can save a life.

Contacting School

Please refrain from telephoning the school, other than for urgent purposes. Email is the preferred means of communication. Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents/carers and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance. This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception. Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.
